Pretend you are **Tracker**, and imagine you are climbing into The Henry Ford's **1943 Willys-Overland Jeep Runabout** to track down artifacts related to the *PAW Patrol* pups here in the museum.

Start near The Gallery by General Motors, and head toward the *Agriculture and the Environment* exhibit.

Find the **circa 1905 International Harvester Manure Spreader**.

Spreading manure is a way to recycle waste and improve the health of soil for planting crops on farms. Who recycles and reuses materials in *PAW Patrol*?

Rocky does! He loves to say, "Don't lose it, reuse it!" and "Why trash it when you can stash it?"

Next, walk to *Miniature Moments: A Journey Through Hallmark® Keepsake Ornaments*.

He can be kind of clumsy, but who doesn't love **Marshall**? The Henry Ford's big fire trucks are not on display, but there are lots of fire trucks (and fire dogs!) in the **Miniature Moments** exhibit.

Now, fly over to *Heroes of the Sky*, and find the **1939 Sikorsky VS-300A Helicopter**.

Igor Sikorsky tried to build a helicopter in 1909, but it wasn't possible yet. In 1938, he developed the first practical helicopter in the United States: the VS-300A. Who flies a helicopter in *PAW Patrol*? **Skye** does! How is this helicopter similar to Skye's? How is it different?

Enter the *Driving America* exhibition. Can you find the 1979 Matchbox Police Car? Hint: It's in a glass case near the Holiday Inn room display.

Matchbox is a popular toy brand that was introduced in 1953 and is now owned by Mattel. Matchbox cars are focused on utility vehicles — those designed to carry out a specific task, like trucks, buses, jeeps and more. Who drives a police vehicle in *PAW Patrol*? **Chase** does! How is this police car similar to Chase's? How is it different? How does Chase help the people in Adventure Bay?

Walk toward the Drive-In Studio. In a case near the entrance, can you find the 1955-60 Tonka Road Grader Toy?

Tonka Toys produced a number of construction-related toy vehicles, including this road grader, plus dump trucks, cement trucks, steam shovels and cranes. Who drives construction vehicles in *PAW Patrol*? **Rubble** does! What kinds of jobs does Ryder ask Rubble to do to help around Adventure Bay? Do you like to dig and build like Rubble?

Head to the *Railroads* exhibit, and look for the giant 1923 Canadian Pacific Snowplow.

Snowplows are necessary to keep trains moving in harsh winter weather. This 20-ton, wedge-type plow was pushed by one or two locomotives along the track to remove snow. Which *PAW Patrol* pup gets called in when a winter rescue is needed? **Everest** is always ready to go in ice or snow! Ryder calls on Everest when he needs help with a winter rescue.

Among the cars behind the model train display, can you find the 1974 Warrior Concept Car?

McKinley Thompson built this prototype vehicle with a plastic body that would float, could be steered in water while its wheels moved it along and had a removable top. Which *PAW Patrol* pup's main vehicle goes in and on water? **Zuma's** does! What color would the Warrior be if it was Zuma's vehicle? Zuma often helps Cap'n Turbot and his boat. Do you remember what his boat is named? It's The Flounder!
