

## MOTOR MUSTER 2017 CELEBRATES THE 50TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE PONTIAC FIREBIRD.

We mark the 50th anniversary of the Pontiac Firebird in 2017. General Motors first answered Ford's runaway Mustang success with the Chevrolet Camaro in September 1966. Five months later, GM's performance brand got into the game, and Firebird hit showrooms in February 1967. When the Trans Am package debuted for 1969, Firebird finally had muscle worthy of the company that gave us the GTO. Four years later, Pontiac dressed up Trans Am's hood with that glorious phoenix decal (the "screaming chicken," to those with a sense of humor). Today, few cars are as iconic of the mid-1970s. Firebird carried on through the 1980s and 1990s before bowing out after 2002, eight years before Pontiac itself disappeared. But the car left an enduring legacy on the street and on the track, as well as in starring roles on the big and small screens.


