We welcome the Jackson Home to Greenfield Village in 2026. Within its walls, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and his allies planned the historic Selma to Montgomery marches of 1965, contributing to the passage of the landmark Voting Rights Act later that year. American automakers produced a record 8.8 million vehicles in 1965. Mustang sales soared, muscle cars multiplied, and Ralph Nader's *Unsafe at Any Speed* put safety front and center. Motor Muster spotlights this important year in a transformational decade.

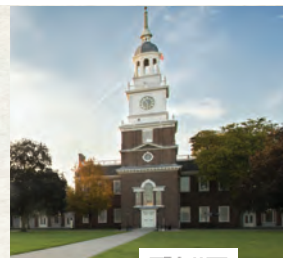
