TYPICAL DUTIES

Internship students assist engineers and technicians in road, bridge, and facilities work related to design, construction, inspection, soils, testing, surveying, and project administration.

Duties can include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Read and interpret construction plans and specifications.
- Perform, compute, and verify measurements and analyses.
- Perform testing, including quality and strength tests.
- Participate in traffic plan reviews and inspections.
- Utilize design programs to help develop plans, specifications, and proposals.
- Perform design surveys, use survey programs to develop diagrams, and maintain survey equipment.
- Participate in the inspection of asphalt and concrete placement, and bridge work.
- Assist with project management, administration, and project file organization.

OVERVIEW



The Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) is responsible for the development and delivery of the state of Michigan's transportation program. Internship students work with MDOT staff, who provide engineering, technical, inspection, and project management services related to the program.


MDOT's Internship Program offers valuable on-the-job training to undergraduate students interested in careers in civil engineering, civil technology, construction management, or land surveying. While participating in this program, students will gain work experience, develop professional competence and long-range career goals; integrate work experiences with academic knowledge; establish a professional network; and earn income that can help cover the cost of a college education.

WORK SCHEDULE AND COMPENSATION

The work period can last up to six months (May I - Oct. 31) per year depending upon MDOT's staffing and operational needs.

- Internship employees are eligible for overtime compensation per union work rules.
- Competitive pay rate (see Internship website for current rate).
- Flexible work schedules contingent upon operational need.
- Worksites are available throughout Michigan in MDOT's seven regions and in the Lansing bureaus/divisions and offices.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

- Must be an undergraduate/graduate student enrolled in and studying engineering, civil or construction technology, construction management, or land surveying.
- Cumulative GPA must be 2.0 or higher.
- The following minimum credits are required:
- □ 1st year 24 semester or 36 term
- □ 2nd year 36 semester or 51 term
- □ 3rd year 48 semester or 66 term
- □ 4th year 60 semester or 81 term
- □ 5th year 72 semester or 96 term
- □ 6th year 84 semester or III term
- Most recent official transcript.
- Successful completion of a preemployment drug screening.
