


# WELCOME TO THE 66TH ANNUAL OLD CAR FESTIVAL

By the late 1910s and '20s, Americans were quickly adapting the relatively new automobile technology to their need to explore the great outdoors. This era saw the rise of "car camping" and the birth of the travel trailer industry right here in Detroit. It also coincides with the official beginning of the National Park Service on August 25, 1916. What began as an uneasy relationship between the NPS and the automobile eventually found common ground, and by the 1920s, hundreds of thousands of Americans were finding their way to our parks — in cars. Join us as we explore America's passion for camping with a display of early camping vehicles and equipment.
