WEDDING CEREMONIES

Martha-Mary Chapel was built in Greenfield Village in 1929, inspired by New England's colonial churches that were the center of community life. Henry Ford named this nondenominational chapel after his mother-in-law, Martha Bench Bryant, and his mother, Mary Litogot Ford. The bricks, front doors and doorknobs are all from his wife, Clara Bryant Ford's, childhood home. The chapel bell, circa 1835, is attributed to the Revere Company, Boston, Massachusetts.

The first wedding was held in Martha-Mary Chapel on June 22, 1935. The bride, Ellen MacMillan, was from Detroit, and the groom, Arther Lamminen, was the director of the soybean extractor plant at Ford Motor Company. Martha-Mary Chapel continues to be a favorite site for private wedding ceremonies, offering a traditional and picturesque setting for couples and their special guests.
