

NINETEENTH-CENTURY MOTORING

The automobile defined the 20th century, but its origins lie firmly in the 1800s. Karl Benz patented his pioneering Motorwagen in 1886, and American auto manufacturing was underway by the mid-1890s. Some of the country's most storied makes — Oldsmobile, Stanley, Packard and Buick among them — started in that decade, and many future industrialists took their formative steps. In 2025, Old Car Festival recognizes the automobile's earliest years with a salute to 19th-century motoring.
