

ABOUT OUR SENSORY-FRIENDLY EXPERIENCE IN GREENFIELD VILLAGE

The Henry Ford seeks to provide safe, unique and engaging experiences for our members, guests and families with ASD (autism spectrum disorder) and SPD (sensory processing disorder).

Our sensory-friendly programming has been designed using expert advice and guidance from a network of educational and medical partnerships. Sensory-friendly events and programs vary throughout the year, but at their foundation are accommodations (i.e., pre-visit materials, noise-canceling headphones and earplugs, quiet zones, modifications to sensory input, and customized programming) that provide access to a broad range of experiences at The Henry Ford.

WORKING FARMS

- Sounds: train whistle near and at Firestone Station, Amtrak trains go behind Firestone Farm, Richart Wagon Shop (hammering sounds)
- Smells: Firestone Farm Barn (animal smells) and Farmhouse (cooking/food smells), William Ford Barn horses, may smell coal from the train's steam
- Things to See/Do: Firestone Farm (farm animals, cooking, etc.)
- Mobility Considerations: steps into Firestone Farmhouse and Barn; some walkways are unpaved by Firestone Farm

LIBERTY CRAFTWORKS

- **Sounds:** Armington & Sims whistle (9:30 a.m., 12 p.m., 5 p.m.), train whistle
- Water: Mill Pond
- Tactile/Hands-On: can touch woven cloth in Weaving Shop, block letters in Printing Office
- Things to See/Do: can see glassblowing, pottery making, printing and weaving
- Quiet Areas/Zones: most of this district is a quiet zone
- Mobility Considerations: ramp for Gunsolly Carding Mill

HENRY FORD'S MODEL T

- Sounds: Model T's, train whistle
- · Smells: exhaust from Model T's
- Things to See/Do: ride on a Model T (additional cost)

RAILROAD JUNCTION

- · Sounds: train whistle
- Smells: may smell coal from the train's steam
- Tactile/Hands-On: inside the DT&M Roundhouse
- Things to See/Do: help with the DT&M Roundhouse's turntable
- Quiet Areas/Zones: the area near Edison Illuminating and the restrooms

MAIN STREET

- **Sounds:** train whistle, Sir John Bennett Sweet Shop clock, Herschell-Spillman Carousel, Town Hall during shows, J.R. Jones General Store during shows
- Water: Suwanee Lagoon, small pond behind A Taste of History
- **Smells:** A Taste of History, Eagle Tavern, Frozen Custard, Sir John Bennett Sweet Shop, Carousel Confections
- Tactile/Hands-On: can try on hats at Cohen Millinery, can play Games on the Green (when available), can try Doctor Howard's mortar and pestle (when available)
- Things to See/Do: grab a custard, ride the Herschell-Spillman Carousel (additional cost), play Games on the Green (when available), see a show in Town Hall, mail a postcard or letter from the Phoenixville Post Office, visit the Wright Home and Cycle Shop
- Quiet Areas/Zones: near the Green
- Mobility Considerations: steps into Eagle Tavern doorway, steps into Heinz House, steps into Wright Home

EDISON AT WORK

- Sounds: train whistle
- Things to See/Do: Thomas Edison's Menlo Park Complex, phonograph demonstration
- Mobility Considerations: steps into Menlo Park Office/Library, steps to second floor at Menlo Park Laboratory, steps into Sarah Jordan Boarding House and to second floor of this building

PORCHES AND PARLORS

- **Sounds:** train whistle near and at Susquehanna Station, Sounds of America Gallery (music)
- Water: Ackley Covered Bridge pond
- Smells: Mrs. Fisher's Southern Cooking, may smell coal from the train's steam
- Tactile/Hands-On: Burbank Garden
- Things to See/Do: overlook at Steinmetz Cabin (also quiet),
 Burbank Garden, Cotswold Cottage garden, Mattox Family Home,
 Daggett Farmhouse, Noah Webster Home, Susquehanna Plantation
- Quiet Areas/Zones: Burbank Garden, area near Daggett Farmhouse
- Mobility Considerations: steps into the following buildings: Chapman Family Home, Cotswold Forge, Edison Homestead, Giddings Family Home, Hermitage Slave Quarters, Luther Burbank Birthplace, Luther Burbank Garden Office, Mattox Family Home, Noah Webster Home (ramp to the first floor is available at the back of the building), Plympton Family Home, Robert Frost Home, Susquehanna Plantation, William Holmes McGuffey Birthplace
