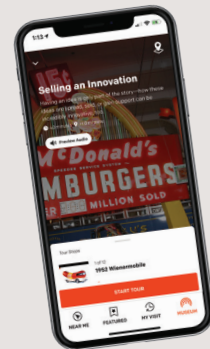

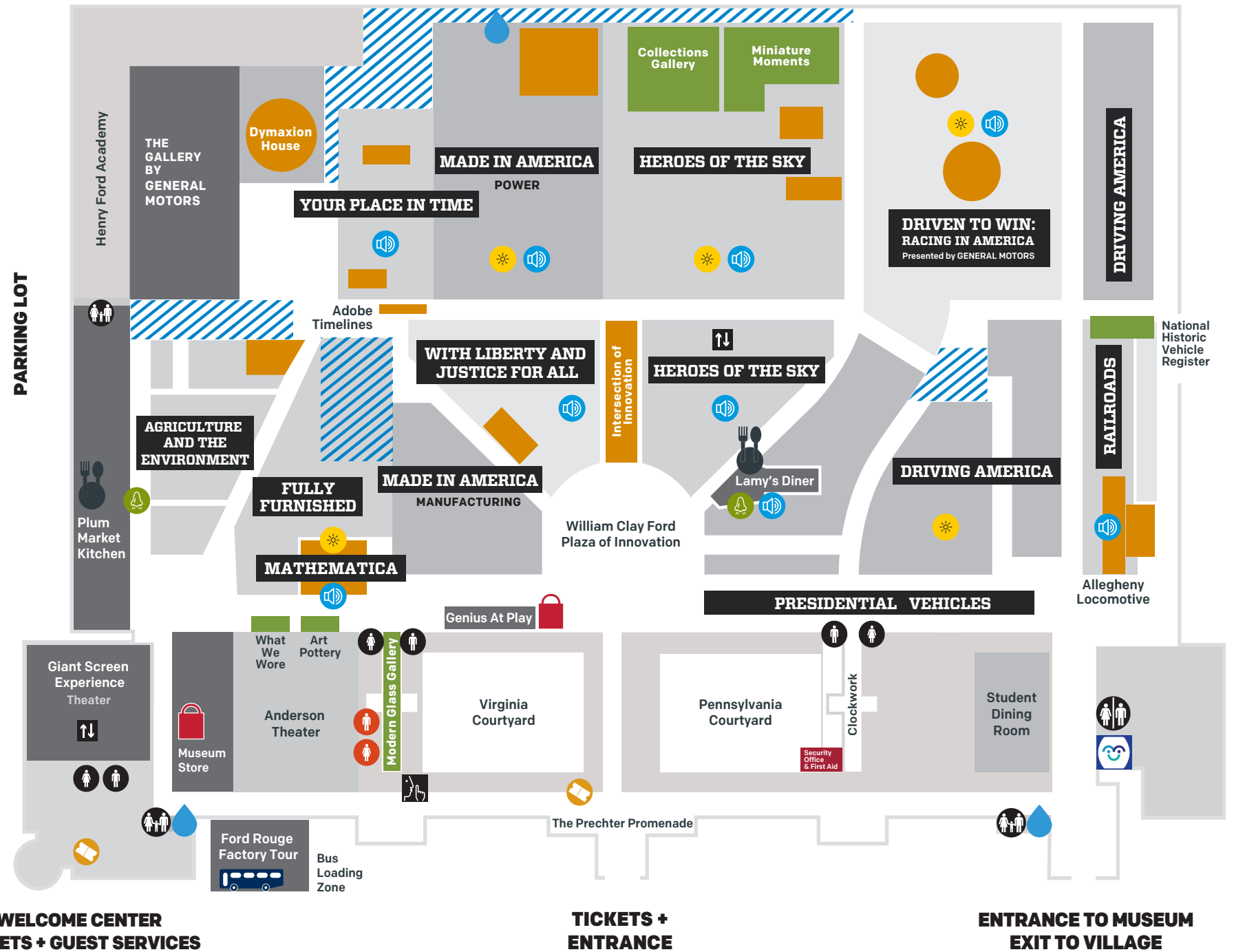

ABOUT OUR SENSORY-FRIENDLY EXPERIENCES IN HENRY FORD MUSEUM OF AMERICAN INNOVATION

The Henry Ford seeks to provide safe, unique and engaging experiences for our members, guests and families with ASD (autism spectrum disorder) and SPD (sensory processing disorder). Our sensory-friendly programming has been designed using expert advice and guidance from a network of educational and medical partnerships. Sensory-friendly events and programs vary throughout the year but at their foundation are accommodations (e.g., pre-visit materials, noise-canceling headphones and earplugs, quiet zones, modifications to sensory input, and customized programming) that provide access to a broad range of experiences at The Henry Ford.

AGRICULTURE AND THE ENVIRONMENT

Smells: Food smells near Plum Market Kitchen

Tactile/Hands-On: Interactive screens near the Sperry-New Holland Combine

Things to See/Do: Sperry-New Holland Combine, George Washington Carver's microscope, #1 Fordson Tractor

Quiet Areas/Zones: Area near Wienermobile and Henry Ford Academy

Mobility Considerations: Steps to enter Sperry-New Holland Combine (please note that entry into the combine is not always available)

DRIVING AMERICA

Sounds: Noise from Lamy's Diner

Lights: Bright lights overhead throughout exhibit

Smells: Food smells from Lamy's Diner

Things to See/Do: Quadricycle, 1931 Bugatti Royale

Quiet Areas/Zones: Quiet space with seating outside Drive-In Theater

Mobility Considerations: Ramps are present throughout exhibit

DRIVEN TO WIN

Sounds: Much of the exhibit has sounds, particularly by In the Driver's Seat Simulators and during the *Fueled by Passion* film

Lights: Some bright lights during the *Fueled by Passion* film

Tactile/Hands-On: Pit crew experience, In the Driver's Seat Simulators

Things to See/Do: In the Driver's Seat Simulators, *Fueled by Passion* film

DYMAXION HOUSE

Tactile/Hands-On: Tactile display of materials used to construct the Dymaxion House

Things to See/Do: Look inside the Dymaxion House and learn more about it from staff members

Quiet Areas/Zones: To the right of the exhibit's entryway

Mobility Considerations: There is a ramp up to the Dymaxion House and narrow doorways into the Dymaxion House

FULLY FURNISHED

Things to See/Do: Doll Houses, Eames Chair Prototype, Marshmallow Sofa

Quiet Areas/Zones: Most of exhibit is quiet except the section closest to Mathematica

HEROES OF THE SKY

Sounds: Be a Wingwalker simulation, overhead sounds by the Wright Flyer, Amelia Earhart/Charles Lindbergh videos

Lights: Flashing lights near the Lindbergh plane, Be a Wingwalker simulation

Tactile/Hands-On: Create a paper airplane and fly it, Be a Wingwalker simulation, airplane seats through time, various other tactile features throughout the exhibit (e.g., can touch airplane wing fabric and a wooden propeller)

Things to See/Do: Create a paper airplane and fly it, walk the 120 feet in front of the Wright Flyer to walk the length of the first flight, 1939 Douglas DC-3, Ford Tri-Motor Airplane, Sikorsky Helicopter

Quiet Areas/Zones: Most of this exhibit is quiet

Mobility Considerations: Elevator available for second floor of exhibit

MATHEMATICA

Sounds: Entire exhibit due to the bell curve ball drop (Probability Board)

Lights: Bright lights throughout the entire exhibit

Tactile/Hands-On: Multiple opportunities to touch items

Things to See/Do: Try out the Multiplication Cube

MADE IN AMERICA: MANUFACTURING

Sounds: Henry's Assembly Line

Tactile/Hands-On: Build a Model T, Henry's Assembly Line

Things to See/Do: Build a Model T, Henry's Assembly Line

MADE IN AMERICA: POWER

Sounds: Corliss Stationary Steam Engine (when in operation), Tower of Power

Lights: Tower of Power

Tactile/Hands-On: Tower of Power

Things to See/Do: See if you can find Edison's last breath in a test tube, watch the Corliss Steam Engine presentation when it is available

Quiet Areas/Zones: Behind the exhibit along the back wall of the museum

Mobility Considerations: Steps leading up to the Highland Park Steam Engine

WITH LIBERTY & JUSTICE FOR ALL

Sounds: Multiple videos playing throughout exhibit

Tactile/Hands-On: Can enter/sit on the Rosa Parks Bus

Things to See/Do: Rosa Parks Bus, Lincoln Chair

Mobility Considerations: Steps to enter the Rosa Parks Bus, tight turns inside exhibit spaces

PRESIDENTIAL VEHICLES

Sounds: Can be noisy if Lamy's Diner is busy

Smells: Lamy's Diner is nearby

Things to See/Do: FDR Sunshine Special, Kennedy Presidential Limousine

RAILROADS

Sounds: Train whistle and bell sounds at the Allegheny Locomotive

Tactile/Hands-On: Climb into the Allegheny Locomotive cab

Things to See/Do: Lionel trains, climb into the Allegheny Locomotive cab, peek into the Bangor & Aroostook, Canadian Pacific Snowplow, Fair Lane Railcar

Mobility Considerations: Steps to climb into the Allegheny Locomotive cab and to peek into the Bangor & Aroostook

YOUR PLACE IN TIME

Sounds: Silent film section at the beginning has loud music and sounds, classroom section has talking and sounds, music video green screen experience near the end of the exhibit has loud music

Tactile/Hands-On: Can sit in the 1917 Overland Touring Car and use toys near the end of the exhibit

Things to See/Do: Take a picture in the 1917 Overland Touring Car, watch a silent picture, make a music video

Quiet Areas/Zones: Behind the exhibit space
