## Nicholas Hersh, Conductor

Over a remarkable tenure as Associate Conductor of the Baltimore Symphony Orchestra, Nicholas Hersh earned critical acclaim for his innovative programming and natural ability to connect with musicians and audiences alike. Refunds will not be issued, but you will be given an option of another Detroit Symphony Orchestra performance at a different location or a daily combo admission ticket to The Henry Ford, or a credit toward the purchase of a new or renewal membership to The Henry Ford.
