

INDIANA AUTOS

Indiana was second only to Michigan in the size and strength of its automotive industry. Haynes-Apperson, formed in 1898, was one of the country's earliest car companies. Makers Duesenberg and Marmon excelled in luxury and engineering. McFarlan produced some of the era's most expensive autos. Stutz gave us America's original sports car. Studebaker built cars in Detroit before shifting production home to South Bend in the 1920s. And Indiana-born Carl Fisher launched the Indianapolis 500 — still the greatest spectacle in racing. We celebrate the nameplates of the Hoosier State with a focus on Indiana autos.
